



ONONDAGA COMMUNITY COLLEGE AT A GLANCE

Onondaga Community College is a two-year college located on a 280-acre campus in Syracuse, NY. OCC operates under the State University of New York (SUNY) system and is locally sponsored by Onondaga County. Bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees are available on campus through the Regional Higher Education Center. OCC is an Achieving the Dream college and has been named a "Military Friendly" school by G.I. Jobs Magazine for its service to student veterans. The College's commitment to sustainability and environmental responsibility has earned it recognition as a "Green College" by the Princeton Review, a "Cool School" by the Sierra Club and a "Sustainable Campus" by the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education. A 2017 report titled "The Economic Value of Onondaga Community College" shows students enjoy an attractive 18% rate of return on their educational investment. For every dollar of support from state and local governments, taxpayers see a return of \$6.70 on their investments. OCC's 17 athletics teams have won 14 national championships

Enrollment: More than 10,000 full-time and part-time students.

Degree and Coursework: Nearly 50 associate degree and certificate programs in majors such as Mathematics & Science, Business Administration, Humanities and Social Science, Criminal Justice, Computer Science and Nuclear Technology. Day, evening, weekend, online and extension courses are offered.

Transfer: OCC has dozens of transfer agreements with four-year colleges and universities. Students can also pursue bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees on the Onondaga campus through the Regional Higher Education Center located in Mulroy Hall. The College has "2+2 Partnership" agreements with Cazenovia College, Le Moyne College, St. John Fisher College, SUNY Alfred, SUNY Oswego, SUNY Potsdam and Syracuse University.

Student Services: Student Central (incorporating admissions, registration, advisement, counseling, financial aid and other core enrollment and student services in one location), career and transfer counseling, nationally accredited Children's Learning Center, Career Center, Education Opportunity Program, Louis Stokes Alliance for Minority Participation, Office of Accessibility Resources, Office of Veterans' Affairs. Student Life: Four state-of-the-art residence halls provide Living Learning Communities for nearly 900 students. The "Lazer Line" shuttle service provides students transportation across campus. More than 25 student clubs and organizations include an award-winning chapter of international honor society Phi Theta Kappa and the Student Association. The on-campus Southwest YMCA provides student memberships at no additional cost with a valid LAZERCARD ID.

Athletics: OCC is a member of the National Junior College Athletics Association. The Lazars have won 14 national championships in Men's Lacrosse, Women's Lacrosse, Men's Tennis and Men's Basketball. The College's 17 athletic teams include: Baseball, Basketball, Cross Country, Golf, Indoor Track & Field, Lacrosse, Soccer, Softball, Tennis and Volleyball.

Financial Aid: More than 80% of Onondaga students receive financial aid in the form of grants, loans or scholarships through the OCC Foundation. Aid may be available for students who carry at least six credit hours and are matriculated in a program of study.
