As part of the recent assessment completed by the CLC in spring of 2024, one of the recommendations from the group was to inform the campus community of the work taking place on a regular basis—hence the creation of this newsletter which will be supplied after each scheduled meeting. At the January 31, 2025 meeting, the following agenda items were covered:

- DeepSeas Presentation—DeepSeas is a consultant that the College is using to assist with our Cybersecurity measures. This work ensures that the college will remain in compliance with mandates and that safeguards are in place for employees and students. CLC will review the risk register (areas of concern) from DeepSeas at an upcoming meeting, and Dr. Hilton asked that the members think about what password changes from 8 to 14 characters would mean to the campus.
- Strategic Plan—Dr. Hilton led a discussion on the updates to the Mission and Vision statements for the College. With the development of the current Strategic Plan, the College did not have time to do a review of the statements. CLC will take up this initiative and asked that the members take this matter back to their constituents for assistance to develop questions such as: do you think the mission and vision statements are relevant? Do you think this accurately reflects what you think OCC is doing? If not, what should change? Questions will be reviewed at the March 28 meeting for distribution to the campus community.
- Middle States: the members discussed where we stand with the reaccreditation process. Writing continues with the self-study and the workgroups are making tremendous progress. Various Middle States events will take place on campus this semester - be on the lookout for those and encourage attendance.
- Shared Governance: The members discussed updating the shared governance chart available on the website. It will be taken back to the constituent groups for revisions and shared at the March 28 meeting.
- Artificial Intelligence: Dr. Hilton reviewed plans for the development of an AI Community of Practice. He asked the members to be thinking of questions we should ask ourselves surrounding about how we use AI. Those questions will be developed into a survey for employees as we move forward in the process.
