*As part of the recent assessment completed by the CLC in spring of 2024, one of the recommendations from the group was to inform the campus community of the work taking place on a regular basis—hence the creation of this newsletter which will be supplied after each scheduled meeting. At the March 28, 2025 meeting, the following agenda items were covered:

- Provost Urtz provided an update on the status of the Middle States Self-Study draft. She explained that work continues on this initiative and we hope to have a more complete version available soon. We expect the campus to be able to review the draft when they return in the fall.
- Shared Governance Diagram—after input from the various constituents on CLC, the final version of the updated Shared Governance diagram was shared. It will be updated on the website and included in evidence for Middle States.
- Artificial Intelligence—Faculty Senate President Olin Stratton mentioned that they have created an Ad Hoc committee to review best practices regarding AI. This is the same group that will work with the larger Community of Practice being developed on campus. The Faculty AI Ad Hoc Committee will develop clear guidelines for a generative AI syllabus statement and assess policies related to AI to ensure they promote equity, academic integrity, and ethical AI literacy.
- Mission & Vision Statements—College Leadership Council discussed the potential survey at length and made these determinations: Faculty do not believe their participation is necessary at this time and are in agreement with the current statements; Students and Staff will move forward with completion of their surveys with reports due back to CLC at the May 16 meeting.
