

**RESOLUTION TO APPROVE

OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE 2026-2027 FISCAL YEAR**

WHEREAS, the purpose and mission of the Onondaga Community College Association, Inc. (OCCA), is to establish, manage and promote educational, cultural, athletic, social, and supportive activities and programs for Onondaga Community College students in collaboration with Onondaga Community College (the College); and

WHEREAS, the OCCA has prepared its 2026-2027 operating budget using a zero-based budget approach consistent with the College's budget model, and the OCCA Board of Directors exercised due diligence in reviewing the 2026-2027 operating budget; and

WHEREAS, on April 29, 2026, the OCCA Finance and Audit Committee presented to the OCCA Board of Directors and recommended Board approval of a balanced budget in the amount of **\$3,889,816** which includes a per semester student activity fee of \$65.00 for full-time students and \$40.00 for part-time students per semester; the one-time new student programming fee of \$34.00 per semester; and the Recreation and Wellness Fee for full-time students at \$125.00 and for part-time students at \$85.00 per semester, and

WHEREAS, the 2026-2027 operating budget provides for and allocates resources in a manner that is consistent with the OCCA and College mission and goals, as well as the mission, goals and objectives of the affiliate entities; and

WHEREAS, the OCCA Board of Directors reviewed and approved its 2026-2027 operating budget at its meeting on April 29, 2026; and

WHEREAS, the OCCA Board of Directors approved a student activity fee of \$65.00 for full-time students and \$40.00 for part-time students per semester; the one-time new student programming fee of \$34.00 per semester; and the Recreation and Wellness Fee for full-time students at \$125.00 and for part-time students at \$85.00 per semester;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Onondaga Community College Board of Trustees approves the OCCA operating budget for the 2026-2027 fiscal year.

RESOLUTION TO CONGRATULATE THE ONONDAGA COMMUNITY COLLEGE
MEN'S NJCAA DIVISION III NATIONAL CHAMPION IN WRESTLING – 174 LBS.
CHARLIE FOSTER**

WHEREAS, Onondaga Community College student Charlie Foster demonstrated remarkable sportsmanship, teamwork, athletic talent and determination throughout the 2025-2026 Wrestling season; and

WHEREAS, originally from Durhamville, New York, Charlie transferred to OCC as a General Studies major from the University at Buffalo, a Division I Wrestling program; and

WHEREAS, Charlie held a perfect record since the program's first meet at the Clarion Open in the 2025-26, including 26 bonus points by pin, technical fall, or major decision; and

WHEREAS, Onondaga sent 7 wrestlers to the NJCAA National Championship and returned with the program's first individual championship title. The men's team finished 21st in the team standings overall, and fourth in the Division III (non-scholarship) standings; and

WHEREAS, at 174lbs, Charlie posted a perfect 5-0 record at the national tournament after coming in as the No. 2 seed. He took on a Division I wrestler from Barton Community College in his first bout, winning by technical fall; took another win over a Division I Northwest College wrestler by tech fall, sending him to the quarterfinal with a Division I wrestler from Southeast Community College in Nebraska - Charlie took the win by major decision. The semifinal round presented another Division I wrestler from North Idaho College, and he secured an 11-1 win by major decision, sending him to the final bout. Charlie took a 4-1 victory over the Division I wrestler from Indian Hills Community College, making him the 174lb Champion; and

WHEREAS, Charlie demonstrated teamwork, skill, and a commitment to excellence, enabling him to achieve at the highest levels within his sport, and his dedication and accomplishments have served as an inspiration to members of the OCC family as well as members of the surrounding community who supported him throughout the season. For the reasons noted above, Charlie was named OCC's Male Outstanding Athlete for 2025-2026;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Onondaga Community College Board of Trustees expresses its heartfelt appreciation and congratulations to Athletic Director Michael Borsz, Wrestling Coach Zach Gifford, and student Charlie Foster who will be remembered for the pride they have brought to the Onondaga Community College campus and to our community as a result of their outstanding achievements.

WHEREAS, the Honorary Associate of Arts Degree is the highest form of recognition offered by Onondaga Community College to persons of exceptional distinction; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the honorary degree is to honor meritorious and outstanding service to the College, the State of New York, the United States, and/or to the community at large and to recognize persons whose lives serve as examples of the College's aspirations for its students; and

WHEREAS, Joseph Cecile grew up in Syracuse where he attended and graduated from Corcoran High School. He then attended Onondaga Community College and Syracuse University, graduating with a bachelor's degree in English Literature; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Cecile's mother and father always instilled in him and his six siblings that public service was its own reward, so soon after college he joined the Syracuse Police Department where two of his siblings were already police officers. He served for over forty years in the Syracuse Police Department, rising through the ranks to eventually become Chief of Police and serving in that role for almost four years; and

WHEREAS, throughout his career Mr. Cecile has always sought to take care of both the community and the police officers. His two goals upon becoming Chief of Police were to decrease gun violence in the Syracuse community, and to improve on the health and wellness of the officers who take care of that community. By the time he retired, both goals had been met with reductions across the board for all gun violence categories, and the implementation of numerous new programs designed to improve the health and wellness of the officers. Mr. Cecile states that "Service is, in fact, its own reward;" and

WHEREAS, a strong supporter of Onondaga Community College, Chief Cecile encouraged the use of the College's facilities for the Syracuse Police Department Training Academies, starting in 2020. That collaboration grew to include hosting the Department's swearing-in and graduation ceremonies as well; and

WHEREAS, for his meritorious and outstanding service to Onondaga Community College, Onondaga County, and the greater Central New York Community, the Board Officers and President Warren Hilton, Ed.D., recommend that the Board of Trustees grant an Honorary Associate of Arts Degree to Joseph Cecile; and

Students from various backgrounds have praised her for her genuine commitment to their success, noting how she goes above and beyond to ensure they not only meet but excel in their math requirements and, in some cases, develop a "love" for math; and

WHEREAS, during the summers of 2024 and 2025, Professor Crawford-Mohat put in practice once again her exceptional teaching methods and her dedication to helping students conquer math anxiety. Over these two summers, she took on the role of principal faculty member for MAT 114 - Intermediate Algebra/Application in OCC's STEM Post-College Summer Program, which is designed to assist students who faced challenges in completing this critical gateway course. Thanks to her extensive knowledge, adept application of effective teaching strategies, and commitment to her students, the program has witnessed remarkable retention and completion rates. Notably, last summer saw 87% of students passing the course, with 80% earning a grade of "B+" or higher. Significantly, all the students returned to OCC in the fall of 2025 to further their academic pursuits, and several will graduate and walk across the commencement stage in May; and

WHEREAS, Professor Crawford-Mohat demonstrates evidence of extraordinary support of OCC students, a strong sense of responsibility and a commitment to the classroom, the Mathematics Department, the College and our Community; and

WHEREAS, President Warren Hilton recommends approval of Mary Crawford-Mohat as the recipient of the 2026 Ralph R. Whitney, Jr., Award;
